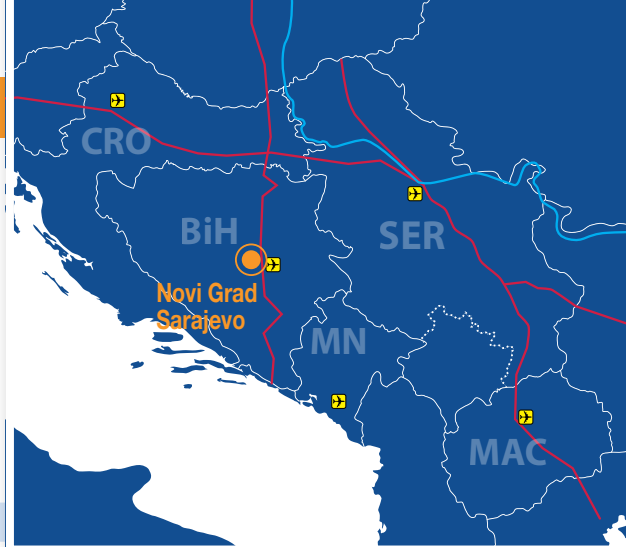

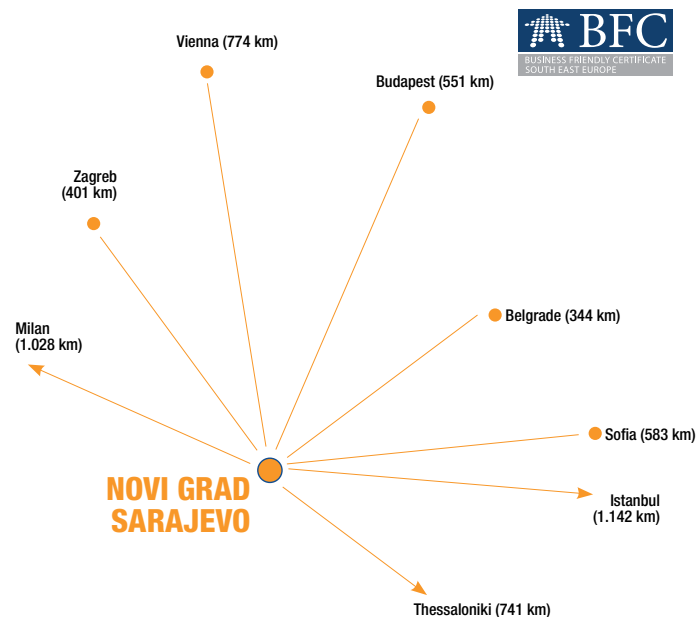

Novi Grad Sarajevo is the most populated municipality in BiH and the "entrance gate" to Sarajevo from Corridor Vc. Being in close proximity to the international airport in Sarajevo, Corridor Vc and international sea ports in the Mediterranean, Novi Grad Sarajevo holds a highly favorable geographic position, with easy access to local and regional markets. With continuous investments in infrastructure and capital investments reaching the value of more than 50% of its annual budget, the municipality stands out as a modern and favorable place for living and doing business. Educated, qualified and young workforce, fully equipped industrial and business zones and local incentives strongly recommend Novi Grad Sarajevo as an investment location. The municipality has already welcomed investors in traditional and new industries such as automotive, chemical, processing, food, and ICT. The local community has been recording continuous progress in terms of construction due to its vast spatial potentials and a vivid business, cultural and tourism scene, being surrounded by four mountains.
